**UOG'S LANGUAGE ARTS CONFERENCE TO FOCUS ON** 

## The University of Guam's 23rd Annual Regional Language Arts Conference (LAC) is an annual event in which Western Pacific educators are provided with opportunities for professional growth and enrichment in literacy. The conference

theme is "Scaffolding Reading and Writing Instruction for Pacific Island Stu-

dents." The conference will be held Friday and Saturday, November 5 and 6, 2010 at the University of Guam and Guam Marriott Resort and Spa respectively. For more information, go to http://www.uog.edu/languageartsconference.

This year's keynote speaker, Dr. Junko Yokota, is the Director of the Center for Teaching through Children's Books and Professor at National - Louis University in Chicago, Illinois. She is the author and co-author of several books, eight book chapters, several hundred thousand dollars of grants, forty journal

articles, and an encyclopedia article. Yokota has given over a hundred presentations in her career, including an invited speech to the Annual Convention of

the American Library Association this June. Her specialty is Asian-American language acquisition, and she was one of the co-leaders of a U.S. delegation to China focused on "Children's Literature and the Language Arts" in November 1994. The LAC will also offer two graduate credits for those who possess at least a bachelor's degree or three CEUs for those who do not hold a degree. As part of the course requirements, students must complete the following: full attendance at the conference; classroom application of one or more of the strategies/techniques learned at the conference; write a brief reflection for each session attended; and write a five-page, typed, double-spaced paper explaining how the Language Arts Conference has increased their knowledge and understanding of using reading and writing for Pacific Island students.
